Such partnerships may be with academics, with other disciplines, with clinicians or with service users – or increasingly with all of these and more! Achieving effective and equitable relationships requires all parties to be clear about values, purpose and boundaries of the collaborative work. Negotiating the principles of this collaboration above the self-interests of individuals, teams and organisations, is a constant challenge across the divides of language, geography and culture.
