What will your gift to nursing be?

By choosing to remember the RCN Foundation in your Will, you'll be making sure members of the nursing team get support when they need it most.

Here are the main ways to leave a gift in your Will:

A cash gift: Known as a 'pecuniary gift', this is simply a fixed sum of money. It could be £100 or £1,000, and it won't change over time.

A share of your estate: Known as a 'residuary gift', you can leave a share or percentage of what's left of your estate to the RCN Foundation after your family, friends and loved ones have all been taken care of. This kind of gift will change over time as it will be affected by inflation.

A gift in kind: This can be an item of clothing, jewellery, or a book collection, to name a few examples. However, as the RCN Foundation do not run charity shops, most of the gifts we receive are not specific items of value.

Olufunke Adeyeye was a nurse and midwife her whole working life, and she felt the challenges that come with being part of a racialised minority.

When Olufunke died, her three children decided to set up an in memorium fund for those who recognise those challenges from their own roles in nursing, midwifery and care.

Their donation of £20,000 established the RCN Foundation Olufunke Adeyeye education grant, a fund dedicated to providing further education and training opportunities to nursing and midwifery staff from ethnic minority backgrounds.

Frequently asked questions about leaving a gift in your Will

I already have a Will. How can I make changes?

You can make changes to your Will at any time. For simple changes or additions, you can use a form called a Codicil. For changes that might be more complicated, you might need an entirely new Will.

Whether you're making a Will for the first time or amending an old one, we always recommend you seek professional legal advice. You can find a solicitor local to you on the Law Society's website: lawsociety.org.uk

What is Inheritance Tax?

Inheritance Tax (IHT) is charged on the portion of your estate that exceeds a certain value at the time of your death. A gift to a registered charity in your Will is tax-free and could possibly reduce the amount of overall Inheritance Tax due. Speak to your solicitor or financial advisor about how IHT might affect you.

Is the RCN Foundation a charity?

Yes, RCN Foundation is a registered charity in the UK. Our registered charity number is 1134606 in England and Wales, and SC043663 in Scotland.

What do I need to include to leave a gift in my Will to the RCN Foundation?

The most important things to include is our name, address, and registered charity number.

Can I leave the gift for a specific area the RCN Foundation funds?
