Children and Young People's Professional Issues Forum (CYP PIF)

Introduction and Acknowledgement:

This CYP PIF report is written and circulated to inform RCN members of the Steering Committee and Forum activities achieved during 2020.

The impact of the Coronavirus pandemic, COVID-19 restrictions and the emergency measures taken by organisations remain in sharp focus.

It is pertinent to thank RCN Children and Young People's Professional Issues Forum Steering Committee, CYP PI Forum members, Peta Clark Professional Lead for Children and Young People's Nursing, Giles Hanratty and Jannathul Ahmed CYP PIF administration support, without whom the work of CYP PIF would not have continued.

The vacancy in the Children and Young People's Professional Issues Forum Steering Committee did not attract any applicants.

Monthly CYP PIF meetings were organised via Microsoft Teams and the attendance has been variable. Additional communication channels are email, Facebook and the Twitter page. The CYP PIF Steering Committee have volunteered to take part in Hivebrite, a new communication platform from which to conduct RCN Forum business.

- Shape, drive and develop nursing practice, providing opportunities for support, advice and professional development
- Advise, influence and inform decision-making to influence current and future health and social policy in the UK and internationally
- Facilitate the work of the CYP Professional issues communities to include operational plans, project bids and Congress activities

- Promote collaborative working across the CYP Professional issues communities and with external organisations
