- 7. Actively participate in RCN Congress 25.
- 8. Submit a bid to run a DNF Learning and Wellbeing Event at RCN Congress 25.
- 9. Contribute to key Defence Nursing events such as the CNO Symposium for Royal Navy, Army, RAF throughout 24.
- Promote the benefits of the RCN and the DNF with Defence Nursing students throughout the year.
- 11. Explore the opportunity to attend/be involved in the Trauma Care Conference.
- 12. Explore ideas for a webinar series (FGM, health security, breastfeeding network) while working with the Mental Health Forum/Women's Health Forum.
- 13. Build links with the Academic Department of military nursing.
