Peer Reviews for GIN - Gastrointestinal Nursing

Conferences and achievements of note are:

- Bekah has disseminated the Liver Competency Framework at the Gastrointestinal Nursing Conference January 2025, and, via the working group, at BASL October 2025 Belfast. Bekah has completed an interview article with the Nursing Standard on Upper GI bleeds nursing and enjoyed a year of leading an amazing group of dedicated nurses working in the specialist of gastroenterology.
- Claire has presented her PhD findings on the priorities for follow up of CRC survivors from minority ethnic groups at the GIN conference 2025 as well as keeping busy promoting Colonic Cancer care and service delivery. Claire has led the publication of Professional development framework for CRC CNSs accredited by the RCN as well as achieving publication of systematic literature review on follow up priorities of CRC patients in GI Nursing. Claire has also worked on a collaboration with ASCN on stoma care standards regarding a joint framework supported by the RCN (the professional leads are involved)
- Julie, RCN Framework for Professional Practice in IBD, along with evaluation data was presented at European Crohn's and Colitis Organisation (ECCO) by Wladzia Czuberdochan (member of the project working party). Julie and Sally have worked with paediatric IBD CNS to develop practice competencies for paediatric nurses working with patients with IBD. Work is close to completion.
- Pearl has been to Congress; actively increased posting activity on social media, which has had an impact on the number of people asking to join the GI forum on Facebook; joined the NECCO committee, which strengthened nursing collaboration internationally;

actively worked with the UK IBD Nurse Research Network, with the first study in analysis and another in progress, has been the Crohn's & Colitis Lead for IBD nursing since April, which, in this role, is setting workforce standards for IBD nursing. Pearl is doing her PhD and presented on November the 5th at Nursing Live RCNI on lower GI pathway. Blogs also completed for RCN and GIN.

- Lisa has completed her study of 'A ten-year audit of an inflammatory bowel disease nursing service' and is publishing this in Gastrointestinal Nursing
- Lisa Gower has worked to complete Blogs and articles as well as represent the forum at conference. Lisa continues to work in palliative care, specialising in ways to improve palliative care referrals for patients with end stage liver disease. Lisa has also applied for a research Internship.
- Amanda has published 2 articles in GIN this year and continue to be an active peer reviewer. As part of her rotation, has contributed to the RCN Blog, was invited to join the BSG Nursing Group, and we've had 2 meetings so far in 2025 and have collaborated with Kathy Whayman on her project with students and also conducted a focus group.
- We have completed and published the 4th Edition of the Liver Competencies Framework, following a successful FGG bid. The working group consisted of four nation representation and all liver nursing specialities, who met online to achieve an update and rewrite of the competency framework. This was a significant re-write of the 3rd edition and will further enhance the career development and complex work of liver nurses.
- We have worked with and supported a successful FGG bid by a group of paediatric gastro CNS to develop Paediatric Gastro IBD competencies.
- We have published the IBD framework for professional practice in January 2024 and have worked to evaluate the impact of the IBD framework.
- Congress was attended by 1 forum member, Grace Abene, and two committee members Pearl and Lisa G.
- Factors that have helped our progress: Leadership from the chair, a positive and supportive team dynamic amongst the committee members Shirley Foster (Project Co Ordinator) and Sally Wilson (Professional Lead).
- Factors that have hindered our progress: NHS time pressures preventing members dedicating time to their development and needs.
