The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) encourages people to share examples of how they have used NICE guidance and standards to improve local health and social care services. Recent examples include.

- Developing a 3Ds (dementia, delirium and depression) clinical framework in a community integrated team.
- Improving treatment and sepsis management in paediatric oncology patients in Wales.
- Autism and environmental adaptations within inpatient mental health units.

PhD studentship

The NIHR Applied Research Collaboration (ARC) East of England invites applications for a fully funded PhD studentship around the theme of inclusive involvement in research for practice led health and social care.

Identifying research priorities

The James Lind Alliance (JLA) brings patients, carers and clinicians together in Priority Setting Partnerships (PSPs) to identify and prioritise the top 10 uncertainties, or unanswered questions, about the effects of treatments. The aim of this is to make sure that health research funders are aware of the issues that matter most to patients and clinicians. Recent areas in which research priorities have been identified include.

- Advanced heart failure.
- Degenerative cervical myelopathy.
- Health care associated infections.
- Mitochondrial disease.
- Revision knee replacement.

Research priorities

Mental health research

A new national research network has launched to improve mental health care. The Mental Health Priority Network, funded by the NIHR, aims to drive national collaborations and changes in mental health practice.
