ntil 2016/17, nursing students in England had their tuition fees paid for in full by the UK Government and received maintenance grants.

Since the removal of the bursary, there has been a 30% drop in applications and the number of students accepted onto undergraduate nursing courses has fallen by 4%.

ow more than ever before, the Government must take action.

With almost 40,000 registered nurse vacancies in the NHS in England, the RCN is calling on Government to invest at least £1bn a year into nursing higher education to attract more people into nursing.
