Your commitment

You will be expected to:

- participate in meetings to familiarise yourself with mentor role expectations and outcomes
- attend meetings or teleconferences with assigned mentees (project innovators) comprising four sessions between March and December 2017 including at least one face to face meeting
- it is anticipated that each mentor will support one or two mentees depending on the complexity and level of support that is required. For the final three to four submissions chosen for full development there will be a continuing mentorship commitment during 2018

- provide direct one-to-one support to assigned mentees including advising on project viability, application to practice, the potential for replication and other support
- guide and advise on a structure for further project development. For example, to develop a case for small or large scale change, evaluate or evidence the impact of the change project, support dissemination and presentation or publication of the project to wider stakeholders
- signpost the mentee to additional supportive resources
- keep a record of, and evaluate the mentor role as agreed, to support future learning.
