Research impact

Does having a National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) portfolio have a positive wider impact on a NHS trust's performance? A new study published from Cumbria Partnership NHS Foundation Trust shows a positive association between NIHR-adopted interventional clinical research activity and both a Trust's Care Quality Commission (CQC) rating and it's mortality rates.

NHS innovations

Four innovations are being fast-tracked into use with pump priming by NHS England and support from the Innovation Agency and the Academic Health Science Network (AHSN).

- HeartFlow. Advanced image analysis software to rapidly diagnose patients with suspected coronary artery disease.
- Plus Sutures. A new type of antimicrobial surgical suture that reduces the rate of surgery-linked infections.
- Endocuff Vision. A new type of 'bowel scope' that improves colorectal examination.
- SecurAcath. A device to secure catheters that reduces the infection risk for patients with a peripherally inserted central catheter.
