Tenovus Scotland exists to foster high quality research within the health care professions in Scotland. The small pilot grants support pump-priming research studies of up to 18 months' duration. The next closing date of 15 September 2018 applies to researchers working in the Strathclyde region.

Practice development

The Foundation of Nursing Studies (FoNS) supports nurse-led teams across the UK to help improve patient care through a range of practice development programmes.

Examples of current and completed projects include:

- improving the patient experience of ambulatory care in the surgical assessment unit
- the school nurse rucksack
- recovery and wellness post intensive care unit: using patient diaries
- yoga for people living with dementia in residential care settings
- developing a recovery based quality of life service for people with severe and enduring eating disorders.

Applications are invited for the Health Education England (HEE) north west/ NIHR integrated clinical academic bridging scheme. Nurses and midwives who have or are about to complete a masters level degree or a PhD are eligible to apply for a six month pre-doctoral, or a 12 month post-doctoral programme. Apply by 17 September 2018.

Electronic health record

The Professional Record Standards Body (PRSB) has published a revised set of standards for the structure and content of health and care records, which will support digital information sharing among all professionals and help people access better, safer care.

Patient experience

This updated Cochrane systematic review, *Nurses as substitutes for doctors in primary care*, concludes that the delivery of primary health care services by nurses instead of doctors probably leads to similar or better patient health and higher patient satisfaction.

Research findings

The National Institute for Health Research Dissemination Centre (NIHR DC) critically appraises the latest health research to identify the most reliable, relevant and significant findings. Recent examples include:

- carers of stroke survivors voice an unmet need for practical and emotional support
- giving obese pregnant women metformin had no effect on baby's weight at birth
- additional therapy helps social recovery from first episode psychosis
- case managers improve outcomes for people with dementia and their carers
- asthma self-management programmes can reduce unscheduled care.
