Clinical academic careers

The Health Education England (HEE) and National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Integrated Clinical Academic (ICA) Programme provides personal research training awards for health care professionals. The chairs' report from round 3 of the programme is now available. This report summarises commonly observed weaknesses in applications to ICA personal award competitions, and provides advice and useful resources for prospective Round 4 applicants.

Research funding

Research grants are available from the General Nursing Council for England and Wales. The specific focus of the 2018 call is on *using the evidence-base to improve patient outcomes*. They welcome applications from early and mid-career researchers who are supported as appropriate by more experienced researchers.

Scaling up innovation

The Social Care Institute for Excellence have published a briefing, *Growing innovative models of health, care and support for adults.* The briefing considers how to foster an environment in which innovative, cost-effective and impactful models of care can be shared more effectively, adopted more widely and implemented more rapidly.

Stroke funding

Project grants from the Stroke Association cover the whole spectrum of stroke research - from prevention and risk factors, through to treatment and rehabilitation in a clinical setting and longer-term in the community.

PhD studentship

The Centre for Health Services Studies at the University of Kent are offering a 3year PhD studentship. Applications are welcome to undertake research in health services and evaluation, commencing in autumn 2018.

Apply by 1 March

The James Lind Alliance (JLA) brings patients, carers and clinicians together in Priority Setting Partnerships (PSPs) to identify and prioritise the Top 10 uncertainties, or unanswered questions, about the effects of treatments. The aim of this is to make sure that health research funders are aware of the issues that matter most to patients and clinicians. Recent areas in which research priorities have been identified include:

- <u>cellulitis</u>
- <u>contraception</u>
- <u>cystic fibrosis</u>
- scoliosis.

Health and Care Research Wales has launched the health PhD studentship award. Applications are welcome across a range of health topics. Priority areas are prevention and early intervention, chronic conditions management, and service organisation and delivery.

Tenovus Scotland exists to foster high quality research within the health care professions in Scotland. The small pilot grants support pump-priming research studies of up to 18 months' duration. The next closing date applies to researchers working in the Strathclyde region.
