The following research funding opportunities are relevant for nurse or midwife researchers. Closing dates for June include the following grants:

- early career small grants and project grants, Diabetes UK, closes 1 June
- priority programme awards, Stroke Association, closes 13 June
- research grants scheme, Macmillan Cancer Support, closes 4 June
- research grant, British Scoliosis Research Foundation, closes 30 June.

Public health

Research impact

The Medical Research Council public health intervention development scheme is now open. This supports the early stages of development of public health interventions. Awards are worth up to £150,000 for a maximum duration of 18 months.

Apply by 12 July

Research for Patient Benefit (RfPB) is a national NIHR programme that funds research on a regional level through eight regional advisory panels. New panel members are recruited on an ongoing basis, and nurses are encouraged to apply.

Applications for project grants and PhD studentships from Breast Cancer Now are open. They fund research that supports improvements in the prevention, detection and treatment of all forms of breast cancer, and welcome applications from all disciplines.

Practice development

The Foundation of Nursing Studies (FoNS) supports nurse-led teams across the UK to help improve patient care through a range of practice development programmes.

- exploring health and wellbeing in prison through a peer research approach.

The Healthcare Improvement Studies Institute is funded by a grant from the Health Foundation. The new institute is founded on the principle that efforts to improve care should always be based on the best quality of evidence.
