Journey through Service

- The inequality that individuals with learning disability persistently face in accessing mainstream healthcare is evident.
- Enabling adult nursing students to gain skills and knowledge to work in partnership with people with learning disability is proposed as an approach to ensure future nurses are better prepared for future practice.
- Involvement of 'experts by experience' in nurse education is advocated internationally.

Educational development

- Interactive learning disability awareness workshop for 3rd year adult nursing students.
- Normalising and valuing the input of individuals with learning disability to nurse education.
- Trust/Relationship building activities with individuals with learning disability and carers/family.
- Role modelling application of 'reasonable adjustments' and advocating meaningful involvement of individuals who use services.
