




Progress and challenge in delivering safe and effective care 2023 - newly published report

We've launched our latest report on the impact of the Nurse Staffing Levels (Wales) Act 2016 on health care delivery.

Our third annual <u>progress and challenge report</u> has shown that the act has increased the number of nurses on wards covered by Section 25B. This requires health boards to calculate and take 'responsible steps' to maintain the nurse staffing level in all wards where it applies. This requirement is directly improving patient care, but stricter operational guidance must be developed to ensure that the benefits of safe staffing levels are seen across all NHS nursing care settings.



We're campaigning for the extension of section 25B to community and inpatient mental health units and for the application of statutory guidance to section 25A. In 2018, 25B applied in adult acute medical and surgical wards. It was then extended to children's wards in 2021.

This updated publication acts as a supplement to Female Genital Mutilation: An RCN Resource for Nursing and Midwifery Practice (011 168) and focuses on professionals working in travel health services. Travel health organisations, clinics and health care professionals will find it useful as it highlights how important it is for processes within travel health settings to be reviewed to ensure services provide an effective safeguarding process around FGM.

Genital Examination in Women

This latest edition provides standards and sample assessment tools for training in genital examination in women for registered nurses working in sexual and reproductive health settings, and related health and social care settings.


